Training Policies

- 7. Cancellations and registration for substitutions are permitted one full business day prior to scheduled training. Refunds are not available.

Allergy Awareness: Managing Allergies in the Early Care Setting

Food related allergies are rapidly increasing food safety and public health concerns because food allergies impact close to 10% of all children in the United States. This number is estimated at 1 in 13 children, or around 2 students per classroom. Children as young as newborns can have allergies to food ingredients within breastmilk and formula. This training will focus on food related allergies in relation to early education programs. The training will include guidance for the development of plans to prevent an allergic reaction, identifying symptoms, responding to a food allergy emergency, and the top foods that trigger allergic reactions. Excellence in early care begins with keeping children healthy and safe.






